when, on July 28, several miles out from Fort Hall a front axle broke, it looked like the end of the trail for the little wagon. Whitman, however, was not to be deterred. Sawing the wagon-box in two, he made a cart out of the hind wheels and pressed on. A tired but triumphant party rode into Fort Hall early in August, the cart leading the procession. On August 4, the Whitman party left Fort Hall and the cart went along. Two Indians accompanied them, one named Kentuck and the other sporting the rather plebeian name of Rottenbelly. At the Island Crossing of the Snake, the cart overturned almost drowning the mules that drew it. The cart became a greater problem each day. Snake Fort (Fort Boise) was reached on August 19. There Whitman was forced to leave his precious cart. Though he failed in his avowed purpose to take a wagon through to the Columbia, Whitman had added another stirring chapter to the westward movement and had lengthened the wagon trail from the Green river to Fort Boise on the Snake. Four years would elapse before others carried on.

Attend Inductions
Friends Invited to

Friends and relatives of Oregon men being inducted into the army have been invited to be present at the impressive induction ceremonies which conclude the day-long process of selection for service.

The invitation is extended by Colonel J. J. Fulmer, commanding officer of the Oregon recruiting and induction district.

In order to properly honor the men who are forsaking civilian pursuits to fight for their country, Colonel Fulmer has arranged ceremonies which include farewell talks to the inductees by the civic and business leaders of the state of Oregon.

These swearing-in rites are held in the auditorium of the spacious seven story building at 614 S. W. Eleventh avenue in Portland, a structure which is now joint induction headquarters for all the armed services.

Colonel Fulmer extended this invitation, he stated, so that Oregon citizens might be present when their friends and relatives take the all-important step which marks the transition from civilian to military life.

The Home Front

Ways With A Waffle
"A PENNY for your thoughts" isn't the only bargain. It costs only a penny to brown waffles for sixteen minutes. And if that puts notions into your head, as it did into mine, then we've partly filled the gap made by the other breakfast, lunch and Sunday-supper favorites that have gone to war.

Even with the same old waffle recipe, you don't have to repeat yourself very often. For example, ever try grape-nuts in waffle batter? Sprinkle two tablespoons grape-nuts over the top of the waffle batter after it's placed in the waffle baker. Lower lid and bake as usual. Use chopped nuts or shredded dates in exactly the same way. And, when not too short on bacon, add two slices of uncooked bacon after pouring batter on the iron.

Once you get the waffle baker off the shelf, you really should try these teatime and Sunday-supper sandwiches: Take a pack-

age of cream cheese, blend with one tablespoon grated orange rind and two tablespoons finely chopped candied ginger. Spread on thin slices of bread, butter outside, and toast between waffle grids. And whenever you're asking yourself what to serve for dessert, make some gingerbread in the waffle baker and serve with ice cream, cream cheese or lemon sauce.

If you aren't especially partial to any one waffle recipe, perhaps you'd like to try the one that's stood by me for many years.

MENU
Broiled Open Face Hamburgers on Whole Wheat Bread - Mustard
Horseshoe Sauce
Cabbage and Beet Salad
*Waffles
Syrup

Waffle Recipe
2 cups all-purpose flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
2 cups sifted dry ingredients together. Blend shortening into flour, as when making biscuits, working the ingredients until they resemble cornmeal. Beat egg yolks and add milk. Beat together thoroughly. Then add dry ingredients, and beat only until liquid and other ingredients are thoroughly blended. Fold in the egg whites which have been beaten stiff. Preheat iron and bake 3 to 4 minutes. This recipe makes 12 waffles.
