GEN. WM. MOULTRIE
DEFENDER
OF CHARLESTON
1776

SGT. WILLIAM JASPER, OUTSTANDING HERO IN THE WAR FOR AMERICAN INDEPENDENCE, DISTINGUISHED HIMSELF UNDER GEN. MOULTRIE AT FORT SULLIVAN, CHARLESTON (S.C.) HARBOR, JUNE 28, 1776, WHEN HE RECOVERED THE STATE FLAG AND, IN THE FACE OF DEADLY FIRE, ATTACHED IT TO A

SPONGE-STAFF AND REMOUNTED IT ON THE RAMPARTS. THE ENEMY WAS DRIVEN OFF. FOR HIS BRAVERY, JASPER WAS PRESENTED WITH A SWORD BY GOV. RUTLEDGE OF SO. CAROLINA, BUT DECLINED A COMMISSION. HE WAS KILLED AT SAVANNAH-1779.



APR-12-1942, LT. ROBERT F. AUGUR, COAST ARTILLERY OF PORTLAND ORE., AWARDED DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS FOR EXTRAORDINARY HEROISM DURING ENEMY FIRE IN EXTINGUISHING FLAMES THREATENING AMMUNITION DUMPS, CORREGIDOR, P.I. HE WAS SEVERELY WOUNDED.

War Farm News

county farmers to finance increased food production will be completed

MEAT SUBSIDIES
Clackamas county slaughterers will be able to obtain forms and information for applying for the

RFC subsidy in the meat price rollback program from the county USDA War Board. Application forms are expected soon, and slaughterers will be notified as soon as they are available. Subsidy payments will be tied in closely with the slaughter permit and the quota program.

MEAT FOR HOME USE

Regulations affecting slaughter of home produced livestock provide that only resident farm operators may slaughter for home use without a permit.

CUSTOM SLAUGHTER PERMIT

As a further step to control meat supplies, regulations have been issued requiring all custom slaughterers of livestock to obtain permits. Applications for permits should be filed with the County War Meat Committee.

SURPLUS VEGETABLES

A program has been set up to prevent distribution problems from causing any seasonal loss of fresh vegetables. Any evidence of surplus vegetables will be reported by the county USDA War Board to the State War Board. Steps will then be taken to move the surplus to where it can be used.

GRAIN STORAGE

Oregon growers will not have a repetition of the grain storage problems experienced last year. Heavy movement of wheat for feed and other purposes has cleared a lot of space so that terminal and warehouse storage appears adequate for the 1944 crop. However, transportation may prove a bottleneck, which the large amount of farm storage constructed last year may help to solve.
