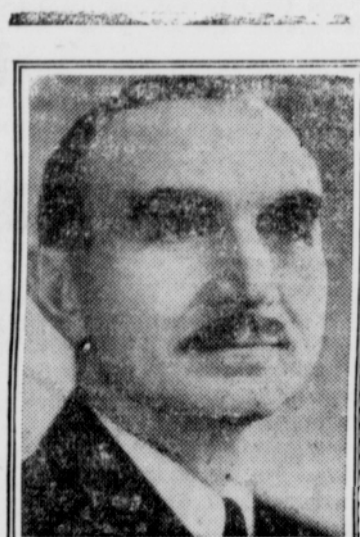

NEW DELIVERY SCHEDULE FOR MEADOW LAND DAIRY

For Sandy the retail deliveries will be made only on Monday, Wednesday and Fridays. This means the Friday delivery will have to carry the customer over the week end or for three days.

The Dodge Park delivery will be made on Monday and Friday. Estacada deliveries will be made on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

Wholesale deliveries will be made at the Sandy stores six days a week.

The last daily delivery will be made on March 29. The driver, John Neiger wishes the customers with questions to see him or leave an ote for him. If you are unable to catch him customers may reach the dairy by calling Gresham 4820. Walter Anderegg is the manager.
