FARM HELP WILL BE BADLY NEEDED THIS YEAR

Anticipating unusual demand this year for seasonal labor, Ralph Lose of the Farm Labor Employment office for Clackamas county is urging farmers to file their estimated needs as early as possible.

In former years the growers often depended to a large extent on migratory workers who followed the harvests but it is doubtful if this help will now be able to move so freely from place to place. The problem then becomes strictly local with the need for housewives and children to form a "land army" to fight for production.

A large number of requests for this platoon help is expected so it will be of mutual benefit to the farmers and to the volunteers to file their application early.

Many requests for pre-season workers are now on file, as well as permanent jobs for both single and married men. The immediate need is for people to string hops and hoe strawberries and about April 20th canneries rharb will be ready to harvest.

USE MORE AGGS DURING APRIL

Use an extra egg wherever possible in cooking while eggs are plentiful this month, urges Janet Taylor, Clackamas county home demonstration agent. Adding an egg to various dishes adds food value and gives color, flavor and richness.

In these days of rationed meat, alternates are often required, and eggs are one of the best. An average, moderately active adult requires about 70 grams of protein daily, about 500 grams of protein a week, according to the committee on food and nutrition, National Research Council.

Homemakers will be wise to provide a supply of cooking eggs for a late season by storing a quantity now when they are cheap and plentiful. Eggs may be frozen and stored in a freezer-locker or preserved at home by use of mineral oil, water glass or "dry ice."
