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Literature and posters are being distributed this month by the Clackamas County Public health association and 1800 other associations in the United States for the purpose of teaching the public the facts concerning tuberculosis.

The association has a year-round program of education but in April, an early diagnosis campaign is carried on by way of being a dividend returned to the people from the Xmas seal sale.

The simple facts that tuberculosis is caused by a germ, it is not inherited, it is a communicable disease, and the germs are easily passed from one to another, if found before signs and symptoms appear and properly treated can be cured. It can be prevented by finding all those who have it and putting them under treatment so that others will not be infected.

"Tuberculosis is entirely unnecessary," said Dr. Dan P. Trullinger, county health officer. "We know how to find it early before symptoms appear. We know how to treat it. But, we need the help of the people themselves and so they need to know these facts brought out by the Early Diagnosis Campaign."

SLOW DOWN TO 35 MILES  
URGES SEC. OF STATE

Closer observance of the war-time speed limit of 35 miles an hour was urged today by Bob Farrell, secretary of state, who declared that reduced speeds save dwindling gasoline supplies and decrease wear on tires.

Speed checks made by the state highway department showed that during the first three months of this year 85 percent of the drivers on the Pacific Coast highway travel at speeds of 50 miles per hour, Farrell said. Only about ten percent of the drivers listed limited their speeds to 35 miles per hour.

"Conservation of gasoline, tires and the prevention of accidents are necessary to the maintenance of essential civilian highway transportation," Farrell declared. Speed also increases the accident hazard and the severity of accidents at speeds of 50 miles an hour or over is far greater than at speeds under 35 miles an hour.

"In the interests of efficient highway transportation and safety every Oregon driver should be willing to observe the war-time speed of 35 miles an hour."

RASPBERRY CROP  
IS AGAIN MENACED

The red raspberry crop in this county is again menaced by the raspberry leaf roller which caused considerable loss in the 1943 crop according to Turner Bond, assistant county agent. Though it occurred last year in the greatest numbers in the area near Gresham this pest was found in rasp-

berries near Oregon City and further south.

Entomologists at Oregon state college have recommended a spray program for control of the leaf roller to be carried out during the latter part of April. The larvae can be found on the young leaves of there d raspberry at the present time and can be located by observing the webbing and rolling of the leaf characteristic of this insect.

Spray for control of this pest is made up of 4 pounds of lead arsenate, 100 gallons of water and 1 quart of oil base sticker. This mix is to be applied at a rate sufficient to get a thick covering of all leaves. Growers can determine the need for treatment by observing the amount of infestation in the plantings. If worms are found on any appreciable percentage of the plants spraying should be carried out.

Although this pest has not yet caused any severe loss on berries other than red raspberries it is recommended that plantings of other berries adjacent to the reds be sprayed also if the leaf roller is found on their leaves.
