Notice of Seock Running at Large

Whereas as the General Primary Election held May 19, 1944, in Bull Run precinct, Clackamas County, State of Oregon, described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Center Line of the Sandy River with the North line of Section 25, Township 1 South, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian, which point is in the North Boundary of Clackamas County; thence up stream along the Center Line of said River through Sandy Glacier to the Summit of Mt. Hood and which point is in the Easterly Boundary of Clackamas County; thence Northwest along the Easterly Boundary of Clackamas County to the Northeast Corner of said County; thence West along the North County line to the place of beginning.

A vote was taken for and against stock running at large in Bull Run precinct above described and said vote resulted in a majority of votes being cast against stock running at large in said precinct, the vote being 300 yes 26, 300 No 38.

Therefore in accordance with the Statute in such cases made and provided it shall be unlawful sixty days after the date of this notice for stock to run at large in Bull Run precinct under penalty of a fine of not less than Ten Dollars, and not more than One Hundred Dollars.
