### Cut Berry Tops Promptly If At All—McWhorter

Cutting off the tops of strawberry plants after harvest is recommended only where strawberry leaf spot is bad or where the strawberry crown moth is present says O. T. McWhorter, extension horticulturist of OSC. If the tops are cut off he recommends their removal with a scythe, sickle or knife immediately following harvest after which they can be raked to the center of the rows and burned to destroy the leaf spot disease. Delaying topping long after the end of harvest has resulted in sharply decreased yields the next season McWhorter says.

Some growers follow the practice of leaving one plant in every eight to serve as a trap for moth eggs. After the eggs are deposited these plants are then destroyed.

### FORD PLANT DELIVERS 42 BOMBERS IN ONE DAY

Delivery of 42 bombers in one day, that's the new record at the Willow Run bomber plant where for several months big four-engine Liberator bombers have been rolling off the mass assembly lines at the approximate rate of one bomber every hour. It was revealed today by J. R. Davis, Ford western regional manager.

The mass delivery of bombers at Willow Run occurred April 24 after several days of "April showers" held up flying activities and resulted in more than 90 bombers being accumulated on the Willow Run airport, Davis reported. This is believed to be the greatest number of airplanes in one day from any heavy bomber factory in the world.

"In one day" Davis pointed out, "we delivered more than 25 percent of the total big bombers which the army air forces had just before Pearl Harbor. All of Gen. McArthur's forces in the Philippines had fewer four-engine bombers than we delivered from Willow Run that day. And when one compares the firepower and improvements in these new bombers with those early models," he asserted, "one gets the terrific impact of the job being done by Henry Ford."

Next to their record in mass production of bombers Willow Run officials perhaps are proudest of the fact that no Ford bomber has ever been refused by the army, Davis disclosed. The extensive tooling for mass production has also resulted in precision manufacture of bombers parts.

So uniform is the manufacture and assembly of the big Liberators at Willow Run that 64 percent of all Ford bombers are accepted for the army on their maiden flights Davis said. The other 36 percent usually need only minor adjustments which necessitate one or more additional flights.

### JEEP'S FARM USE IS LIMITED

While the army "jeep" may have limited use on farms for hauling purposes it has several serious limitations as a source of drawbar power BAE reports. The jeep is not adapted to the cultivation of row crops since it has little clearance and its wheel spread is not adjustable to take care of variations in the width of rows. Then, too, the jeep uses more fuel, its motor is geared to high speed, which causes it to wear out sooner than the small type farm tractor pulling heavy loads at low speeds.
