Checked in All Counties

A survey of farm equipment inventories and allocation in Oregon as of June 1 has been made by the state and county USDA war boards to insure full use of all allocations in the state says R. B. Taylor state war board chairman.

Where allocations to counties were not being fully used transfers to other counties where the equipment is needed were arranged. It was found however, that far more counties had exhausted their allocations and were needing more than had excess machinery on hand. Some was found available for re-allocation.

LOGANBERRY ACREAGE
WILL BE INCREASED

The Clackamas county loganberry acreage which has decreased gradually during the past few years is expected to make a sharp increase next spring according to County Agent J. J. Inskeep who says that one of the large canneries operating in Oregon is contracting for crops from the new plantings.

Growers who expect to make new plantings should arrange for plants in the near future, says the county agent, as loganberries produce more and better plants from new canes which are buried or tipped for this purpose. Unless contracts are made this summer and arrangements are made for plants a serious plant shortage may occur.

The county agent has learned that new contracts call for prices set by the Loganberry Control board and contracts may run until 1950.
