"ICECAPADES OF 1945" COMING TO PORTLAND

Hailed as the "super-dooper" of all ice shows the most dazzling, eye-filling spectacle in the history of frozen entertainment the fifth annual edition of the renowned Ice-Capades, will make its bow at the Portland ice arena starting July 27.

Each year Ice-Capades has unfolded a new brilliance, an achievement that has jumped its national attendance from 500,000 who saw the first, 1941, edition, to a record of over 2,500,000 who witnessed the 1944 production.

According to advance reports unusual emphasis has been placed on costuming and production of the Ice-Capades of 1945, and the ice extravaganza this year represents \$3,000,000 in costuming, rehearsals and other preparations.

There are seven major production numbers topped by "Fiesta," one of the most lavish, beautiful and expensive numbers ever presented on stage or ice. It features most of the big cast of 152 and is a tribute to our South American neighbors. Other major spectacles include, "Parade of the Wooden Soldiers," "At the Ice-Door Canteen," "Dresden Holiday," "They were the Days," "These Are The Days," and the finale, "The Royal Canadian Northwest Mounties" in which the cast salutes our northern neighbor and those stalwart guardians of law and order.

Besides the major numbers, there are other production specialties including "Poetry in Motion," "Dance of the Scarfs," and "Cover Girls" featuring 16 Orcaettes, the most beautiful and cleverest of the Ice-Cap's pets.

SAVE THAT PAPER BAG

A declaration of policy asking the voluntary cooperation of retailers and shoppers in the conservation of wrapping and packing materials was issued last week by WPB chairman Donald M. Nelson. Needs of the military service for paper and paper products for overseas operations are so great that remaining supply is not adequate to provide for

present rate of civilian consumption.

When shopping consumers are asked to take along their own used shopping bags and paper bags in which to carry their purchases; to accept without wrapping articles in manufacturers packages which can be safely carried unwrapped; and to salvage all usable wrapping paper and cardboard boxes.

HOW GAS IS DIVIDED

Roughly here's what happens to the 12 gallons of automobile gasoline that can be made from a barrel of crude oil. 4 gallons must go to the army, 3 gallons (actually a little more) must go to trucks, buses and taxicabs, 1.4 gallons must go to farmers and industrial users. That leaves only 3.6 gallons for all civilians.

NEW REGULATIONS REGARDING LUMBER

The following new regulations regard the sale of lumber by the mills were recently made and have been sent to local mills.

1 All orders, OPA, government or otherwise may not be shipped after August 1st without first being certified. OPA business now on books will be certified between now and July 20th.

2 All mills must have OPA orders on their books to cover at least 35 percent of their expected output for the month to apply on army, navy, maritime commission, Marine corps, coast guard and War Shipping administration orders. However, all OPA business will not necessarily apply on your 35 percent quota, only business that is invoiced direct to one of the government agencies shown. We will inform you on each OPA order you take from us whether it applies on the 35 percent quota.

3 If you cut less than 25M per day you do not have to comply with the 35 percent requirement on government orders but under the order you must accept these orders if offered to you and it is possible for you to cut them out of your logs, up to 35 percent of your order file.

4 All orders must be certified. Some will bear both certificates and a rating. Certified and rated orders for the same class of materials are to be shipped ahead or an order certified only but not rated. By the same token higher rated orders for the same material are to be shipped ahead of one with a lower rating regardless of their dates.

5 On your retail sales the order provides you may not sell to an individual or firm unless they can furnish you a certification. The farmer obtains his certification from the county agent, war foods administration. All others obtain theirs by application to the war production board.
