Safety Rules Given for Volunteer Farm Workers.

In connection with farm safety week the National Safety council has prepared a few common sense suggestions to prevent volunteer workers from becoming farm front casualties. Here are some of the pointers relayed by the OSC extension service.

Have a medical checkup; get at least eight hours sleep every night; eat a good breakfast, carry a hearty lunch and drink

plenty of cool water; bend knees instead of back when lifting; call for help when job is too heavy; make sure ladders are strong and set as proper angle; use the right tool for each job and make sure you know exactly how to use it; never unclog, oil or adjust a machine unless it is completely stopped speak reassuringly to animals when they are approached so they will not be startled and kick or bite; follow directions of driver or supervisor or when riding on trucks or buses; take no chances with infection and get first aid for even the smallest cuts and scratches.

LARGEST R. C. PRISONER CARGO TO EUROPE

The largest shipment of Red Cross prisoner of war parcels yet made in World War II is now enroute to Marseille, France aboard the sister ships Travancore and Mangalore, which sailed from Philadelphia, it was announced this week by the American Red Cross. This is the first time two prisoner of war ships from this country have sailed the same day.

Largest and fastest of the Red Cross fleet the motorships carry a combined cargo of 1,320,000 standard food parcels and a considerable quantity of clothing for American and allied prisoners of war in Europe. The ships recently built in Sweden fly the Swedish flag and are manned by a Swedish crew. They are under charter to the International Committee of the Red Cross at Geneva.

Left-over Chicken Baked in a Roll



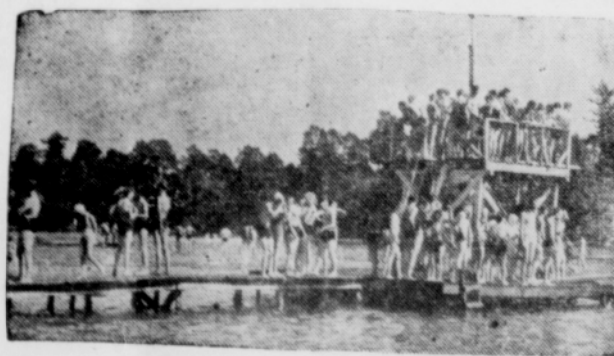
Chicken Roll (with apple rings)

There's nothing like the chicken that's served on the farm. There are great heaping platefuls of it, brown, juicy, and tender. Much of this appetizing appearance and flavor can be attributed to the cooking; and while roasted chicken used to be the most popular method, broiled chicken is fast becoming its rival. Many farm homes have stoves with broilers, thanks to "bottled" or "tank" gas which gives modern gas service to suburban, small city and farm areas.

Leftover chicken often reappears in tasty dishes which are substantial and satisfying, and best of all, require no meat points. Our suggestion for today is Chicken Roll.

Chicken Roll
2 cups ground leftover chicken
1 small onion, ground
1 teasp. salt
1/4 teasp. pepper
1 teasp. bottled horse-radish
1/4 cup chicken gravy
2 cups baking powder biscuit dough
top milk
Combine chicken, onion, salt, pepper, horse-radish and gravy. Roll out baking powder biscuit dough, using two cups as a basis, into a rectangle about 9" x 12". Spread chicken mixture on dough and roll up, jelly-roll fashion, pinching edges together. Place on greased baking sheet, brush with top milk and bake at 450 degrees for 25 minutes or until done. Serve sliced with a cream sauce garnished with finely chopped chives. Serves 6.
