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## A REPLY TO GOVERNOR WARREN

"For eleven long years we have been in the middle of the stream. We are not amphibious. We want to get across."

Thus keynoted California's Governor Warren at the Republican national convention. On the republican side of the stream we had the experience of 14-280,000 unemployed and 25,500,000 undernourished men, women and children. Wages and farm income the lowest in 30 years. 1932 Republican administration failed. Wages in lumber mills \$1.60 per day for 10 hours. 1940 wages for same work \$5.12. Farm income, Republican prices, Wheat 34c per bushel, hogs \$2.90 a hundred, steers \$2.56 a hundred, cows \$1.50 a head, butter 16c a pound, eggs 12c a dozen and farm income for the year 1932 4 1-4 billion dollars, the lowest in 30 years. Democratic prices, 1941, wheat 89c per bushel, hogs \$11.25 a hundred, steers \$10.50 per hundred, cows \$40 to \$75 per head, butter 30c per pound, eggs 30c a dozen.

Farm income for the year 1932 8 1-4 billion dollars and for 1941 11 1-2 billion dollars or more than 2 1-2 times the income of 1932. ## Broil These DeLuxe Hamburgers



Looking for a recipe to keep cool? Just pop all your supper foods into the broiler. It will cook them quickly, save fuel, and keep cook and kitchen cool during warmer days.

It's a good idea to serve broiler meals in the gay informality of the porch or garden. Give the family a real picnic, minus the sand and mosquitoes, of course.

Cooking in the broiler gives that grand outdoor flavor much like the foods cooked over open fires of the beach or woods. Broiler cooking, however, is much simpler. To do it, just light the flame and set the temperature controls at 350° F. Best results are obtained when this temperature is maintained throughout the whole broiling period.

"Bottled" and "tank" gases provide regular gas service in farm and suburban areas where city gas mains do not reach. These liquefied petroleum gases make possible the clean, hot flame so desirable for broiling. Broiled foods are not only more appetizing, but easily digested.

Here is a good porch-picnic supper menu, with all foods except dessert prepared in the broiler unit.

Broil hamburgers first, and when they are almost done, pop in halved fresh tomatoes sprinkled with salt and pepper and buttered crumbs. Broil for about 10 minutes. During the last 5 minutes, toast split, buttered buns and heat the potato chips. Serve with cole slaw salad. Fresh strawberries and cream is the dessert suggestion.

## DeLuxe Hamburgers.

(Serves 6)

1 pound ground beef  
1 egg  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
1 tablespoon minced onion  
1/4 cup catsup  
1 cup sliced onion  
8 slices bacon

Combine meat, egg, seasonings, and catsup; mix well. Form into thin patties. Brown sliced onion in hot fat. Put meat patties together, sandwich fashion, with sliced onion in between. Press edges together; wrap with a bacon slice and fasten with toothpick. Place patties on broiler rack 3-5 inches from heat. Broil 7 minutes on each side.

## OPA Seeking Better Way To Learn Farmer Needs

OPA is making definite progress in setting up machinery to obtain the farmer's viewpoint in price regulation procedures according to Tyrus R. Timm agricultural economist in the office of agricultural relations in the OPA who held a meeting at Oregon state college with representative agricultural officials recently. With Timm was Verne Livesay recently with the FSA in Portland and just appointed agricultural relations adviser for the western region.

Since setting up the office of agricultural relations only seven months ago agricultural advisers have been established in six regions Timm reported. He also said that 40 industry advisory committees now have farmer members and that a new livestock price committee has just been set up with farmer representation.

Timm and Livesay discussed with officials of the extension service, the AAA, FSA and state department of agriculture ways by which difficulties such as the recent lamb situation and certain ceiling price rulings might be avoided in the future thru better advance understanding on both sides.
