## AAA On Calendar Year; Closing Date December 31

Opening and closing dates for AAA conservation practices have been placed on a uniform calendar basis for all parts of Oregon by action of the state committee, Chairman Robert Taylor has just announced. Coast counties and eastern Oregon were previously on this basis.

Effect of the change is to extend the closing date for 1944 practices from September 1 to December 1 in Willamette valley and southern Oregon counties, Taylor explained. This may be important to many AAA cooperators who can continue this years projects thru the fall months.

The state committee considered other seasonal matters as well as next years budget at the session just held at the state headquarters on the OSC campus.

## EXTENSION UNITS ELECTS OFFICERS

Election of officers for the Clackamas county home extension committee was held at the regular meeting held on Monday, August 28. Mrs. Geo. Henderson of the Stafford unit was re-elected chairman; Mrs. Ross Rider, West Canby unit vice chairman; Mrs. L. E. Carlisle, Oak Grove unit, secretary-treasurer. This committee serves as an advisory board to the home extension agent and assist in the planning and administration of the countywide program for rural home-makers.

Other business in addition to the election of officers included a discussion of the year's project program. Miss Janet Taylor home extension agent announced that as a result of the vote on the two proposed programs eight homemaking projects had been selected by the extension unit members in the county. They will be presented at the regular meeting of home extension groups thruout the county beginning in October. Included in the year's program will be a slip cover clinic, tying of springs, care of shoes and feet, making bedrooms more liveable, professional garment finishes, wartime meal planning, quick breads and rolls and a discussion on women and the law.

It was also announced that a new group has been organized in the Union Mills community and will meet regularly as an extension unit starting in October. Firwood unit which has been inactive this past year has reorganized and will again participate actively in the program. At the present time, there are a total of 19 organized extension units in the county which will engage in the program.
