A SWORD UPON THE EARTH

After the big "break-thru," in Normandy and a company of paratroopers had taken their objective, a strategic point among the hedgerows of France, an American lad, still battle-begrimed, penciled these lines:

"The long battle over we trudged up the hill
And paused to look back at our comrades so still,
From our hearts rose a prayer that they died not in vain,
Our Pals, yes the heroes of Purple Heart Lane."

As we contemplate the heroism and courage displayed by our soldiers upon this and a thousand other battlefields, we are made to wonder if we, the soldiers of the Cross, are as dedicated to the conquest of warfare.

Sometimes the question is raised in Christian ranks, "Are we at war?" To these we have but one reply. If the Church is not at war, then it is unfaithful to Christ. No such soldier ever lived as Jesus Christ. Talk about your McArthurs and Montgomerys; our Stonewall Jacksons and General Marshalls, General Clark and of the others combined cannot compare with Him who came that he might "swing a sword upon the earth."

You see, Christ was not just passively good, but he was actively against all evil men and every bad thing. He was and is against false weights and measures; he is against all trickery in trade and insincerity in social life; he is found in the small village of Nazareth or the teeming city of Jerusalem. Let us not forget that, Christ never met evil without smiting it in the face.

But may we as Christian soldiers take heed lest we be armed with the wrong weapons. There are many wrong weapons in the church you know; there is the digger of Dispute. Some people will dispute over the ritual, the form of worship, posture of prayer. Some will even dispute the Word until they get so far behind as to almost miss their own funeral. So far are they behind the grand procession of true militant conquest they never hear the trumpet call to battle. Miserable word jugglers, theological hair-splitters; forgetting the sun and all its wealth of summer; plodding along Gods good earth oblivious of romantic June emptying her lap upon the landscape. They must always be in a dispute or they will not think themselves Christians. But that is a miserable weapon, and it will ultimately fail along with the hand that wields it.—The Village Pastor.
