You seem quite anxious to have me define my court policies. I am glad to do it.

First of all I will follow the law implicitly in the transaction of county business. The commissioners will have the fullest opportunity in making decisions as they are men of ripe and valuable experience which should not be lost. As chairman of the court I will give them formal notice of business sessions or upon their wish we will get together as equal. Politics will be adjourned. Business will be the order of the day.

Yes, I will draw my salary but if I make any extended trips on private business I will refund to the county the amount covering the time lost.

I will make no promises to anyone unless authorized to do so by the commissioners. In simple language we will work as a court, and for that reason I cannot tell you now what the real setup will be. I will favor no drastic changes for political reasons that might upset smooth working conditions. Efficiency will be the yard stick.

You might be interested in the county printing. No doubt the outgoing small printers will be given just consideration. It is the duty of the court to see that justice prevails in all its deliberations. Politics should be kept out of that too.

I will not wrangle with persons who have perplexing problems and are very anxious to get consideration. A servant of courtesy will be my motto. The business at hand will take precedence over all else. All persons coming before the court will be heard in an orderly manner without wasting time in idle discussions.

I will try to expedite business as much as possible without curtailing the fullest consideration by all court members.
