Sugar Consumption Gains But Still Under Prewar

Consumption of sugar in the U. S. is running materially higher in 1944 than for any year since rationing began according to a summary of the sugar situation received by Miss Lucy A. Case, extension nutritionist at OSC.

About 450,000 tons more sugar were used during the first eight months of 1944 than for the same period in 1943 the figures show. OPA officials estimate that about 95 percent of all sugar stamps are used with almost all stamps issued in rural sections turned in.

Home canners, soft drink manufacturers, bakers and candy makers as well as commercial canners have all received larger allotments of sugar this year than last the report shows. Total consumption will still be below prewar figures however.
