LOGGER, YOU'RE A SOLDIER

"Paul Bunyan and your Blue Ox, we need your help, and quick."

This is the appeal of the U. S. army to the West Coast logging and lumber industry. Lumber, the most critical of all war materials is most critically needed now.

Paul Bunyan, who typifies the logger has been called by the emergency away from the holiday firesides. He must pull on his hobnailed boots and get back into the woods. There is enough milling capacity. There is a reasonable certainty of transportation. But the logger is in the key position.

Demands are urgent for more millions of feet of lumber, principally boards and dimensions, than at any time since the war began. The Nazi breakthrough on the western front has a lot to do with the urgency but not more so than the quickening tempo of war on the Pacific front.

Scores of ships are headed for the Columbia River and other West Coast ports. They want lumber for McArthur's forces in the Philippine offensive. The ships can't be filled with lumber, munitions can't be cased with wooden boxes and crates unless the logs come from the woods and the boards in almost incredible quantities come from the mills. The sawmill men report they can do their end of the job, tough as it is, if they can get the logs.

But the soldier over-the-top spirit is needed to get out the logs. The boys who slog along in the mud will have at their home the compatriots who work at higher altitudes often in the rain. The winter has been, so far, mild and open, almost as if the weather had been set to encourage this form of war occupation.

Every able bodied logger on the job is the appeal, and from Maj. Raleigh Chinn of the army "Boys, we can't let up now. That is the appeal from every fighting man in Europe and on the Pacific. Give us boards, give us crates, give us ammunition, give us the lumber we need to finish this job. But be quick."

Give credit where it is due. The loggers and the mill men have been doing a big war job. They can and they will do a bigger job in order to win the war.

Recent changes in the procedure governing sale of surplus army trucks by the Treasury procurement division are called to the attention of Oregon farmers by the state AAA committee. All truck sales will be made on an informal bid basis and no more negotiated sales will be made according to the revised regulations. The sales are similar to auctions, except that the bids are written and each prospective buyer may make only one bid on any one truck, but may bid on as many trucks as he desires. Under the truck program AAA committees issue letters of recommendation to users seeking trucks who are contributing to the war food program. In case of tie bids authorized dealers buying for resale to users holding these letters are given preference.
