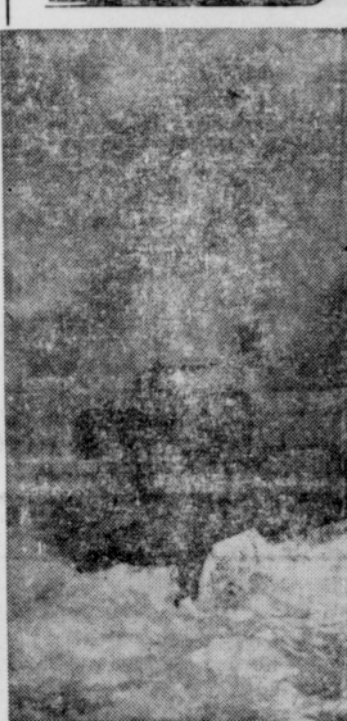
To the People of this Community
