adequately housed at the YMCA or YWCA. Three housing projects suggested for married veterans were Guilds Lake, University Homes and Vanport City.

Approximate costs: At the "Y," \$20; housing projects, \$40 to \$45

Oregon College of Education at Monmouth: Fall registration, six veterans: 30 or 35 expected for winter term. Housing "adequate at the present time," for single men. "Small apartments are available in town for married veterans." Though "not excellent, they are livable," at \$30 to \$40. College dorms have room and board for single men from \$40 to \$45.

Other replies were from Lewis and Clark college and Cascade college in Portland, and Northwest Christian college, Eugene. All reported facilities for single veterans, but dim prospects for the married ones, especially those with families. Virtually all the institutions are expanding their housing facilities, but do not expect construction to be completed for another year or more.

at the Wednesday meeting. In addition, a surplus property panel consisting of representatives from federal agencies responsible for the disposition of surplus property will discuss availability of various items, procedures for obtaining them, and will answer questions.
The Oregon Finance Officers will hold general sessions on Monday and Tuesday. They have scheduled discussions on accounting procedures for tax turnover, procedure for handling financial reserves, procedure for handling bond funds of school districts in county treasurer's office, budget law revision, proposed amendments to the six percent limitation, the revenues of local governments in Oregon, and 1946 budget problems.

11. Family allowances for the term of enlistment for dependents of men who enlist before July 8, 1945.
12. Opportunity to learn one or more of 200 skills and trades.
13. Choice of branch of service and overseas theater in the Air, Ground or Service Forces on 3-year enlistments.
