Telephone Industry Plans Expansion

More than a billion dollars will be spent by the nation's telephone industry for equipment and supplies in the immediate future as a part of its program for more and better telephone service. This statement was made today by Harley J. Barber, manager of the local telephone company, quoting leaders in the industry.

It is further expected that an additional billion dollars will be spent within a few years for necessary construction and maintenance.

Because of the wartime restrictions on manufacture and sale of telephone equipment for civilian use, a huge demand for telephone service has accumulated. At the end of the war, there were more than 2,000,000 unfilled applications and many other potential customers waiting who had not applied for telephones.

While some few of these applications have been filled, there still remains a tremendous demand for telephone service. The industry is answering this need just as quickly as equipment can be manufactured and installed and local conditions can be adjusted to meet the demand.

Telephone companies have been unable to make any kind of major additions to their facilities for more than four years (except for essential needs of the armed forces and the government). In the majority of cases, central office, cable and wire facilities are carrying a maximum load with the number of telephones now in service. Thus, in order to provide new service, much more equipment besides the telephone instrument itself is necessary.

While plans for improvement are many and will be carried out in the near future, the industry's "number one" item on this post-war budget is to fill the essential needs for telephone service as quickly and efficiently as possible.
