Tax Exemption Blanks Here

Affidavits for real property exemption returns are now available at the office of the Sandy Post in Sandy or at the county assessor's office at the court house, Oregon City.

As required by chapter 296, Oregon Laws 1945, amending section 110-201, O.C.L.A. of properties claiming exemption from taxation are listed as follows:

All literary, benevolent, charitable and scientific organizations, all church and other religious organizations, and all organizations or associations owning or operating cemeteries, crematories or burial grounds, tombs, etc., and public libraries must file with the county assessor of the county in which such institution or organization is situated on or before February 1 of this year, a list of all real property claimed to be exempt and show the purpose for which such property is used before any exemption from taxation will be allowed.

File the return verified by the oath or affirmation of the president or other proper officer of such institution or organization and mail to Rufus E. Wood, county assessor, Oregon City, Ore.

Game Commission After Coyotes

Aerial hunting of coyotes again will be sponsored by the Oregon state game commission during February and March of this year. Information gathered by the commission's field men indicate that while the loss of wildlife through coyote predation this season was somewhat less than during the past three or four years, the drain on game populations still is heavy enough to justify further control measures.

The same fliers who operated last season are being employed; Dick Ballantine, Redmond; Al Tilse, Bend; Oscar Davis and



Roe Davis, Burns, it is possible some new areas may be included and a reconnaissance flight will be made to determine the practicability of aerial hunting in other sections of the state.

The aerial hunting is supplementary to the regular work done on the ground by hunters under the cooperative predatory animal control program supervised by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, toward which the game commission, as one of the cooperators, makes an annual contribution of \$12,000.

Fish and game production figures for 1945 show that 13,857, 057 game fish weighing in the aggregate 91,854 pounds, were released in Oregon lakes and streams from game commission hatcheries. Pheasants raised at the four state game farms totaled 33,717, of which 11,736 were released in western and 21,891 in the eastern counties. During 1946 it is hoped to increase these figures considerably as operations are brought back to a normal basis.

Many Errors In Driver Tests

Lack of understanding of Oregon's speed laws and where to file reports on accidents occurring in rural areas headed the list of errors made by persons taking the written law test for Oregon driver's licenses, in a study made during the month of December, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr., said today.

Errors in turning and parking led the list of mistakes made during the road tests by the same group of applicants.

A total of 636 persons, who visited the Salem examination office during the month, made 1,433 errors in the written examination on Oregon motor vehicle laws, and 649 errors in the road test, Farrell said.

Of the total errors made in the written examination, 20 percent involved the Oregon speed laws. Twelve percent involved persons who did not know that accidents occurring in rural areas should be reported to the sheriff of the county in which they occur. Failure to know the regulations on dimming lights, the use of traffic lanes, the use of hand and arm signals and on the right of way were frequent causes of errors in the examinations.

Of the total of 649 errors made in the road tests, 24 percent involved turning and 13 percent involved parking. Fourteen percent of the driving errors involved failure to keep in the correct lane of traffic.

"This study indicates the need for applicants for driver's licenses to become more conversant with such matters as the Oregon basic speed rule, the designated speeds, the right of way law, the regulations on hand and arm signals, dimming and the use of traffic lanes," Farrell said. He urged all applicants to study the Oregon Driver's Manual thoroughly and to get as much actual driving experience under competent instruction as possible.
