SAVE YOUR CHERRIES

The Cherry Fly will soon be here and it is essential to spray and dust immediately. Get complete coverage. The following formulas are recommended by Oregon State Department of Agriculture:

No. 1: Lead Arsenate, 2 1/2 lbs., any commercial spreader, and enough water to make 100 gallons of spray. Apply once now. Second application in about two weeks. If cherry leaf spot evident add 2 gallons lime sulphur on sour cherries or 6 lbs. wettable sulphur on sweet cherries. Wettable sulphur use will avoid burning.

No. 2: The following dust mixture may be used: Lead Arsenate 10 parts, finely divided dusting sulphur 325 mesh or finer, 90 parts. Repeat as formula No. 1. If heavy rains wash off either repeat immediately.

No. 3: Rotonone "75" Dust.

No. 4: Rotonone 4% Spray. Water up to 100 gallons.

If you need help, call the county agent or our field department now. Watch for notification of appearance of fly.

News From Game Commission

Two lake and stream survey crews are being placed in the field this month by the Oregon state game commission. One four-man crew will be assigned to make a survey of the major coastal streams south of the Columbia river to the California line. Their work will include study of fish populations, locking barriers to fish migrations and making recommendations for stream improvements. Some of the more important coastal lakes also will receive attention.

The second crew will work on the major problem lakes in the Cascade range and make initial surveys on a number of lakes not covered in previous years. The men will also engage in improvement work where trash fish are a problem.

With the setting of all the pheasant eggs needed for this year's production at the four game commission game farms, approximately 6,500 adult birds have been released in both western and eastern Oregon. The goal for this year's total production of pheasants has been set for 60,000.

CLACKAMAS VALUES UP

The assessed valuation of Clackamas county real and personal property showed an increase of \$11,741,625 during 1946 over the total for the previous year, according to County Assessor Rufus Wood. The total assessment roll aggregates \$43,859,630 as compared with \$32,118,005 last year.

With an estimate of assessed valuation of public utilities properties in the county of \$14,000,000, the total will rise to \$57,859,630, as compared to \$43,132,004 in 1945. Assessor Wood reported.

Assessed values for 1946 on real property are listed at \$37,444,770; personal property, \$6,677,130, but reductions made by the board of equalization placed the total at \$44,121,900, less veterans' exemptions of \$262,270, making the final total \$43,859,630. County Assessor Wood said that a summary of tax exempt properties in the county aggregated \$58,916,580, divided as follows:

United States government, \$21,447,280; state of Oregon, \$12,962,440; Clackamas county, \$7,100,100; cities and towns, \$4,700,000; school districts, \$5,300,000; water districts, \$1,020,000; fire protection districts, \$14,000; literary, benevolent, charitable and scientific organizations, \$175,000; churches and religious organizations, \$3,109,000; burial grounds, \$18,800, and public libraries, \$40,000.

"TERMINAL LEAVE PAY" LONG WAY OFF

Veterans were cautioned this week not to become prematurely excited over the pending "terminal leave pay" bill in congress because the possibilities are that, should it become law, it will be some time yet before any pay will be available to ex-servicemen for unused furlough or leave time.

This word of caution came from officials of the state Department of Veterans' Affairs, after reports that veterans have started already to make application for this pay in various veterans' aid offices throughout the state, believing that the bill had already been passed.

Actually, Veterans' Affairs spokesmen said, the bill only came out of the house military affairs committee last week.
