Game Commission Distributing Birds

Liberation trucks of the Game Commission now are busy distributing the first of the approximately 60,000 pheasants to be raised this year at the four game farms. The birds are being released in suitable habitat throughout the state on sites selected in advance by the game biologists. In western Oregon the Willamette valley seed stock refuges, which, through agreement with the landowners are closed to hunting for a period of five years, will receive a liberal stocking. At the present time the refuges cover approximately 30,000 acres in strategic locations throughout the valley.

Observations during the past two months indicate a poor up-land game crop in most of the Oregon counties. This condition is attributed largely to June and July storms.

Co. Health Assn. to Seek New Quarters

Officers of the Clackamas County Public Health association were authorized to seek quarters at the special meeting Monday night, pending action of the county court to determine whether other space in the court house is available. Room 207 has been used since 1942 by the association, but is needed for attorneys' use at present.

Dr. J. P. G. Cleland spoke in behalf of the cancer control program and asked the cooperation of the association in furthering the educational program necessary and announced that several local physicians are planning to attend soon the post-graduate cancer course which will be offered this year for the first time by the University of Oregon.

Errol Rees, West Linn, was appointed chairman of the social hygiene committee which will carry on the educational program launched in the county, June 6. A report was made of the transporting of two former tuberculosis patients to Salem for physical examinations; furnishing two pairs of cotton pajamas for a sanatorium patient; and the distribution of a health pamphlet to 627 graduates from the eight high schools of the county.

Joan Propst, Milwaukie, and Donna Carr, Estacada, attended 4-H club summer school on scholarships given by the association. Plans were announced for an educational exhibit at the county fair. Walter W. R. May, president, presided at the meeting.
