"Sunbonnet Sue" To Open Here

A lavish motion picture of the Gay Nineties era in New York, steeped in the atmosphere of the fabled Bowery, comes to the Sandy theatre on Friday and Saturday, with the opening of the Monogram musical film "Sunbonnet Sue."

Stars of the production are Gale Storm, who sings in her father's saloon on the famous street, and Phil Regan, a brash young Irishman who is a candidate for alderman. Their romantic adventures are the moving force in a charming story of a past generation, before life became even more complicated with the perfection of such inventions as the horseless carriage and the moving picture. Other members of the cast are George Cleveland, Alan Mowbray, Minna Gombell, Charles D. Brown, Edna M. Holland and Raymond Hatton.

Popular songs of the era are featured, mainly such perennially popular numbers by the famous Gus Edwards as "School Days" and "By the Light of the Silvery Moon." Miss Storm and Regan are the principal singers and there are also tunes by entertainers in a Bowery concert hall, vying for the attention of the audience with can-can dancers and the attractions of the adjacent bar.

Scenes of old-time New York form an unusually interesting background for "Sunbonnet Sue," which was directed for producer Scott R. Dunlap by Ralph Murphy, and adapted for the screen by Murphy and Richard A. Carroll from an original story by Paul Gerard Smith and Bradford Ropes.

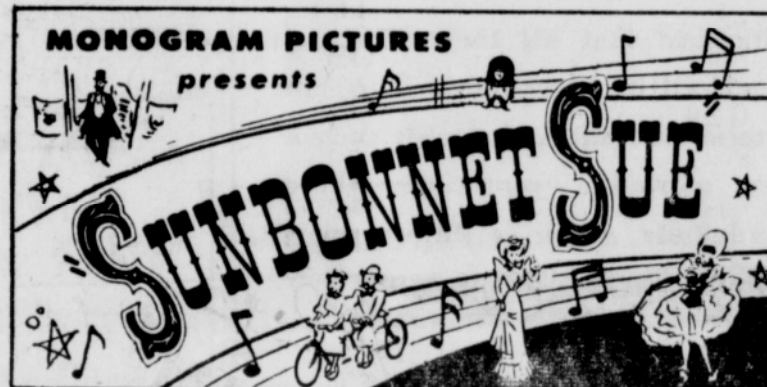
