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Housing Expediter Extends "Freeze"

In furtherance of the veterans' emergency housing program, the regional housing expediter has extended the "freeze" on nine types of new and used construction machinery for an additional 30 days, the Portland War Assets office was advised today.

The machinery was first frozen September 3. The new "freeze" period will expire November 17. During this period the WAA may sell the equipment only to purchasers holding a housing expediter certificate or a Civilian Production Administration urgency certificate.

Frozen items include batching plants, truck mounted and tractor type cranes, ditching machines, portable air compressors, motor graders and wheel tractors of 100 horsepower or more.

Limited supplies of this type of machinery make it probable that the available supply in government surplus may be used up completely during the current "freeze" period. The equipment has been allocated for disposal to nine regional WAA offices as determined by the National Housing Administration. Fixed price value of allocations to date totals \$3,671,391. Additional supplies will be made during the current "freeze" period as the army, navy or other owning

agencies declare construction machinery surplus and turn it over for disposal.

Under the selling procedure, prospective buyers must apply at one of the regional NIHA offices, located at 608 Pacific building in Portland. Certificates are issued to applicants according to their need for the machinery in logging, lumbering, construction of veterans' homes or for producing materials for the housing program. If granted the certificate, the prospective buyer can secure his needs as long as the regional supply lasts. Eligible purchasers will be given the opportunity to buy in the order their certificates are received at the regional WAA office.

Dairymen To Meet

Dairymen of the Molalla-Colton district will meet at 8:00 p. m. October 25 in the Molalla Grange hall to discuss artificial insemination as a means of breeding dairy cattle, according to Ron Davis, assistant county agent.

Vernon Hepler, president of the Clackamas County Dairy Breeders' association, will explain the history and organization of the local unit.

Davis states that the number of inquiries and wide interest in this form of breeding demands a get-together for discussion of facts on the subject.

Similar meetings will be scheduled in other communities throughout the county in an effort to disseminate information on the artificial breeding program.

The Dairy Breeders' association is attempting to sign up enough dairy cows by December 1 to start operations. Hepler states that this can be done only through the cooperation of county dairymen in effecting a rapid sign-up in the next two months.

Mills Speaks at Club

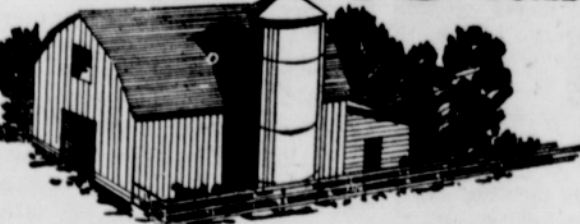
