Around The Campfire
 With John E. Mills

(With this issue The Sandy Post inaugurates its hunting and fishing and wildlife conservation column. John E. Mills has lived in the Sandy area for 21 years and was a forest ranger in the Mt. Hood National Forest for 14 years. He has been attending state game commission meetings for the past 20 years and is known throughout Oregon for his fish and game work. He organized the Lower Columbia River Sportman's Council, the nucleus of today's Oregon State Council of regional sportsman's clubs affiliated with the Oregon Wildlife Federation.)—Editor.

It gave me quite a surprise when The Sandy Post asked me if I would take time out once a week to set up in column form some of my ideas on the affairs of our state pertaining to wildlife, hunting, fishing and outdoor recreation in general.

It didn't take me long to make up my mind to attempt a weekly column—just long enough to ask the little woman who is my camp cook, faggot gatherer-inner and game-dresser what she thought of the idea.

Without the slightest hesitation she said that if the idea had anything to do with hunting or fishing she guessed I'd be doing it anyway. At this point she snorted softly, stamped her foot, tossed her head upward and strode out of the room just like she usually does when I tell her I'm planning another trip into the tall uncut.

So, starting right now with a plea that you will be very tolerant of my outlandish use of the king's English and considerate of my warped sense of humor, I'll start provoking you good people. The Post should not be held responsible for my ideas and observations for they are strictly my own and will be defended by me if it's necessary to do so.

My object in attempting a weekly letter to The Post's readers is to try to bring home to every person within the bounds of its circulation the enormity of the problem that faces us if we are to continue to have game in our forests and fields and fish in our streams. I solicit the aid of every citizen in perpetuating and protecting our natural resources so that all may enjoy them.

I will present, from time to time, my opinions on needed conservation legislation together with comments on existing laws and edicts. (It is my considered opinion that what we need most is enforcement of our present game laws rather than a lot of new laws). I do feel, however, that there are some additions which could be made that would make enforcement of our present laws a little easier.

True, the game department of the Oregon State Police has done little in the way of enforcing game laws to warrant the respect of the average citizen or hunter. But, in spite of departmental policies which have hampered a lot of fine officers, we could have better enforcement if we gave them the support to which they are entitled.

If you think this is a slap at the state police who are charged with game law enforcement, all I've got to say is "Brother, you ain't heard nothing yet."

So, until The Post gets so many threatening letters that they are forced to cut me off, I'll just keep bringing the dope to you each week.

Incidentally, the Steelhead are now running in the Sandy River.
