In scoring their 33 points, the Koch players worked considerably harder than their opponents, who dropped twice as many counters through the hoop in a leisurely manner which did little to interrupt their other miscellaneous sporting activities.

While Haynes paced the Trotters with 16 points, Strong, who dropped in 10 counters, was the delight of the fans with his ability to handle a basketball in the manner that the ordinary man handles a medium-sized grapefruit. Gray paced the Sandy team with 10 points.

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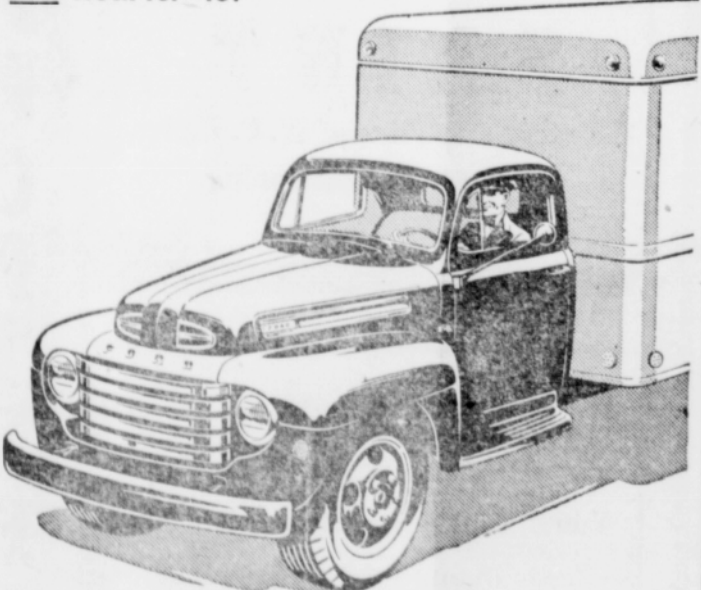
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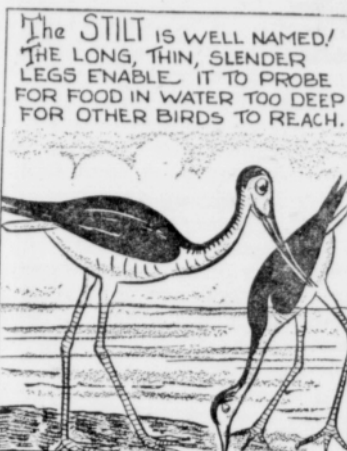
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Don Knight and Superintendent Floyd Light
