Spring Wedding Planned By Miss Ruth Bennett

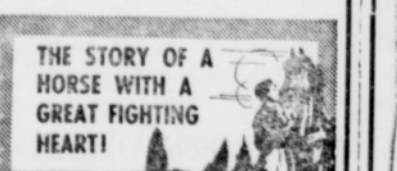
