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Sandy High Pioneers Wind Up League Play This Friday

Mt. Angel Falls to Pioneers, 37-39; Estacada Rangers Win Thriller, 42-40

After shading Mt. Angel 39 to 37 last Friday, Coach Chuck Croston's Sandy Pioneers dropped one to Estacada by the same 2-point margin, 42 to 40, on the Sandy court Tuesday.

Sandy led by a few points all the way in Friday's session at Mt. Angel. Quarter scores were 11-7, 23-22 and 33-28. Center Jim Dyal was high man with 13 for Sandy.

Sandy's five starters worked together with good teamwork and David Hopp played his best ball in several games. Sandy was hitting free throws for a change, sinking 11 for 15; Mt. Angel connected for 9 out of 11.

Tuesday's Thriller

The Estacada game, a real thriller, saw Sandy come from behind to tie the count at 38-all with 45 seconds to go, only to lose.

Sandy started out slowly and had a tough time doing anything right; the boys couldn't hit the hoop with their shots or their teammates with their passes. First quarter and half-time scores were 3-6 and 12-23 in Estacada's favor.

Early in the third quarter, the Pioneers were 14 points behind when the boys suddenly began to click, sparked by sharp-shooting by Williams, Gomoll and Morgan and pivot shots by Dyal. Third quarter score was 23 to 30 in the Rangers' favor. With 45 seconds to go and the count 38-all, one of the Sandy players touched the net and Estacada was awarded what proved to be the winning two points.

One of the highlights of the game was a long shot by Estacada's Lamb just as the gong ended the first half. He shot

three-quarters of the length of the court. Coach Croston says it was the longest shot he's ever seen in the Sandy gym.

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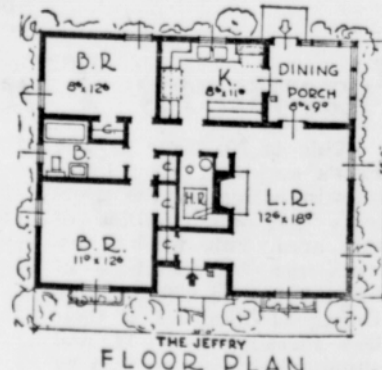
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
