Cherryville Men to Run New Sawmill at Newberg

CHERRYVILLE — V. O. Rice and H. W. Gorrell, whose \$10,000 sawmill one mile north of here was destroyed by fire Feb. 2 this week began operating their new mill at Newberg, 25 miles southwest of Portland.

Four other Cherryville men, J. C. Cox, Wallace Rice, William Meeks and Stirling Collins, also have moved their families to Newberg to work at the mill.

The two men hope that their new all-electric mill and planer mill will hit a daily production of 30,000 board feet. They have rights to three and a half million feet of timber.

NOTICE OF SCHOOL ELECTION
In the Rural School District of Clackamas County, Oregon, Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution.
Notice is hereby given that an election will be held Monday, April 19, 1948, by the Rural School District of Clackamas County, State of Oregon, in all component school districts of said Rural School District.

The election will begin at 8 p.m. and will be held in the schoolhouse in each of said component districts. The purpose of the election is to submit to the legal voters of the rural school district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1948, over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI of the Constitution.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:
The sum of the bases of the component districts of the Rural School District became the base for the new Rural School District. The low bases (in many instances no base at all) held by the component districts made for an inadequate base for the Rural School District making it necessary for the Rural School District to vote to exceed the 6% limit.

The amount of tax, in excess of the six per cent limitation proposed to be levied by the rural school district of Clackamas County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1948, is \$348,442.48.

The Rural School Law gave all district bases to the Rural School District—Therefore any amount voted by a district is over the 6% limit—Receipts from other sources were not sufficient to meet the adopted budget.

The amount of tax, in excess of 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$17,108.75.

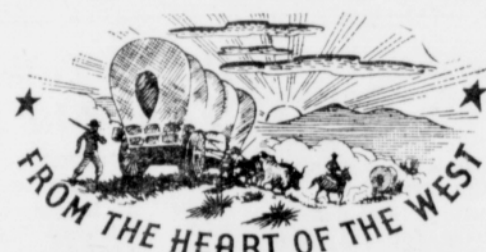
