Mr. Karlen is a former student of the Sandy high school. After leaving school he spent four years with the United States coast guard in Alaska.

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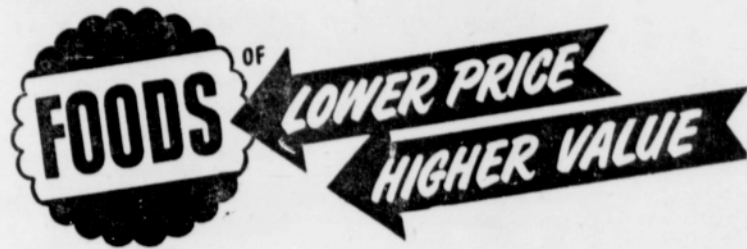
