Mrs. Katherine Bollinger was taken into the local chapter by affiliation. She has transferred from the Eastern Star chapter in St. Paul, Minnesota.

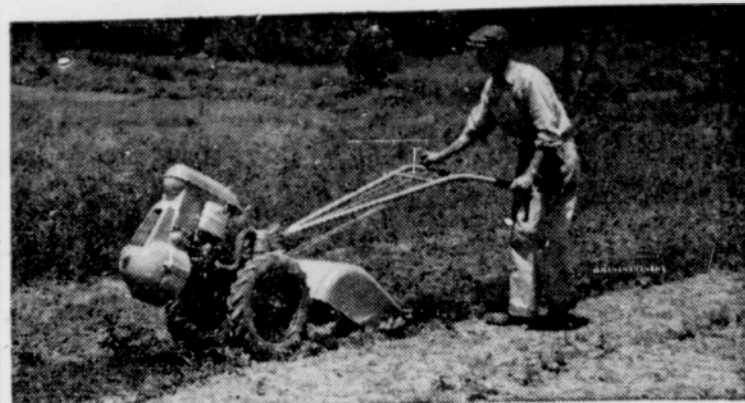
Plans were made for an Eastern Star card party to be held Saturday evening, April 24, in the Masonic hall.

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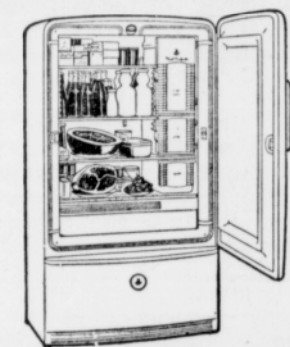
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
