Vet Building Aid Deadline July 1

**\$25,000 Available for
Local Veterans' Halls**

Sandy and Boring veterans' organizations seeking state aid to finance construction or purchase of club buildings have only until July 1 to file application, the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs pointed out this week.

The Clackamas county court is authorized by chapter 595, Oregon laws, 1947, to grant a maximum of \$25,000 financial aid upon the application of any two or more federally recognized veterans' organizations for the acquisition of meeting halls.

According to County Judge E. L. Pope, veterans' groups in only Oregon City and Canby have applied for funds. Groups in Estacada have indicated that they may apply.

The law says the buildings "are to be used as a continuing expression of appreciation to those who are serving and those who have so served (in the armed forces during any war), and as memorials to their comrades who did not return."

The application must specify the amount of money requested, the location of the building, the funds otherwise available, the probable cost and any other information required by the county court.

Spray for Pea Weevils Due in Home Gardens

Home gardeners should dust peas now to ward off weevil infestation, reminds Multnomah county agent W. S. Averill.

Pea weevils are now emerging and can be controlled by an application of $\frac{1}{4}$ of one percent rotenone dust or a 5 percent DDT dust.

Rotenone dust should be ap-

plied on a day the temperature is expected to reach 65 degrees within 24 hours. DDT is equally effective but should not be used on peas if the vines are to be fed to livestock, warned Mr. Averill.
