## Sandy Lumbermen Build Planing Mill

Construction of their new planing mill at Troutdale will begin next week, Alvin Erl and Otto Motejl, Sandy lumbermen, announced Wednesday. They estimate capacity of the mill at 75,000 board feet per day and hope to be operating by Aug. 1.

The two partners, incorporated as the M. & E. Milling Co., have bought a site with one-half mile of Union Pacific railroad track frontage at Wood Village, one mile west of Troutdale.

They intend to buy rough lumber and plane their own as well.

## First Salt Pit

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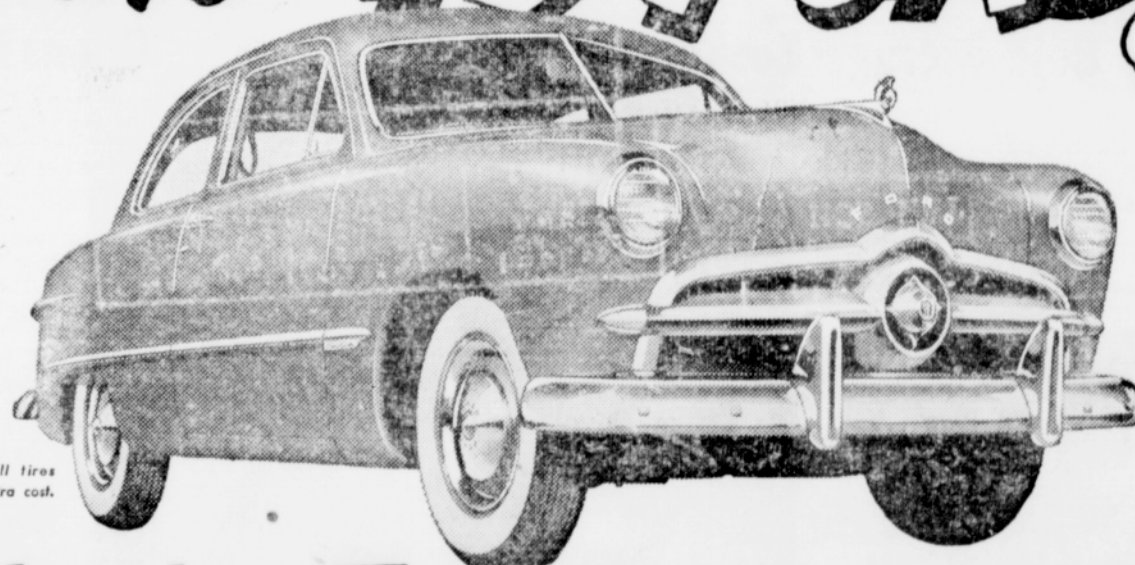
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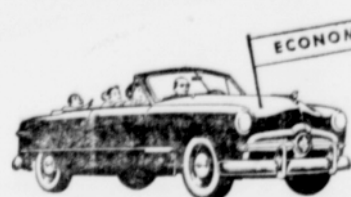
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
