Carol Ann Rapue Burned Fatally

Sister Hurt Escaping From Orient Dwelling

ORIENT—Ten-year-old Carol Ann Rapue died Sunday from burns suffered as she rushed from a blazing room in a house north of here late Saturday night.

The girl died in Portland Sanitarium just 24 hours after she was injured in the blaze that destroyed the five-room house on Harris road.

Her 18-year-old sister, Shirley Rapue, was burned on her feet and hand, but was released after receiving treatment at the hospital.

The victim, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Rapue, was asleep in an upstairs room in the 1½ story dwelling when the blaze occurred. Flames had engulfed the entire roof and upper story before they were discovered.

Awakened by Father
Fire Chief Robert Lipscomb, of District No. 9, reports that the girl was awakened by shouts from her father, who could not get into the upstairs room because of the intense heat. The girl ran from her bedroom but suffered burns on her arms, feet and back in the escape. She was rushed by private automobile to the hospital.

The parents, 4 other children and their grandfather, William Rapue, were in the house at the time of the fire. All escaped without injury.

Cause of the blaze is unknown. Loss is estimated at \$2,500 for the house, owned by Hazel Smith, of rt. 2, Gresham, and \$1,500 for furnishings and personal belongings.

Carol Ann was born in Pueblo, Colorado on Sept. 10, 1937. She came with her parents to the Orient community in 1946.

Funeral services were held Thursday at Carroll's funeral home in Gresham with interment in Forest Lawn cemetery. Rev. Edwin O. Solie, of Powell Valley conducted the service.

Clothing Provided

Members of the family escaped the burning structure in their night-clothes, Chief Lipscomb reported. Clothing has been provided for them from the emergency wardrobe maintained at the fire station for such emergencies by the District No. 9 auxiliary.

The fire-stricken family was given temporary shelter at the home of a friend, Mrs. V. Norton, near Powell Valley.

Time Nears to Spray for Filbert Worm Control

Filbert growers should be making preparations for dusts or sprays to control the filbert worm soon, advises Leon Garolan, Jr., assistant county agent.

The exact time of spraying or dusting will be announced by the county agent as in past years.

At this time growers should test equipment to be sure dusts or sprayers are in good working order and should make arrangements for insecticides.

Recommended control materials are the same as last year. Lead arsenate as a spray or dust is recommended. A 5 per cent DDT spray also gives good control advises Mr. Garolan.
