Soil Saving Work Planned

Plans and provisions of the 1949 Agricultural Conservation Program are being prepared so that farmers of Oregon will not be delayed in making their conservation plans for the coming year.

According to E. Harvey Miller, chairman of the State PMA Committee, the 1949 National outline, approved by the Secretary of Agriculture, has been received. The National outline is made up of practices recommended by the State PMA and County Agricultural Conservation Committees after the advice and assistance of soil and crop specialists of State and Federal Agricultural Agencies. The State Agricultural Conservation Program for 1949 will be developed within the framework of the National outline.

Conservation practices for 1949 have been re-grouped under six major objectives which focus attention on the soil and water problems the practices are to help correct. The first objective is "Practices to Protect Farm Soil from Erosion by Wind and Water." In this group are such practices as construction of dams, terraces, sod waterways, farming on the contour, strip cropping and planting trees.

Other practices are grouped under the following objectives: "Developing Cropping Systems to Maintain Sustained Yields on Range and Pasture," "Practices to Conserve and Obtain Efficient Use of Irrigation Water," Forestry and drainage practices are the other groups.

The county committee, advised and assisted by community committees, will have the county handbook listing the 1948 practices and specification prepared and distributed early this year so that farmers may file their farm plans well in advance of the time when work must start on the practices. It is expected that an increase in the county allocation of conservation funds will allow for a much needed drainage program to assist in eliminating some of the drainage problems in the county.

Enlistments for 3 Years Open

The rush of 18-year-olds to army and air force recruiting stations to apply for 12-month enlistment, and reports of limited quotas for that short term being filled so speedily, are believed to be the basis for false rumors that all army and air force quotas are now filled. M/Sgt. B. T. Causgrove, station commander of the Gresham recruiting office said today.

Many young men calling at the Gresham recruiting office have been surprised to learn that regular enlistments for three-year periods are still open, the Sgt. said.

He pointed out that many teenage youths prefer the regular enlistment, where they have a choice of technical schools and branches of service providing they volunteer before the actual induction gets under way.
