Children of the Daily Vacation Bible School will display their accomplishments at the school at a program and demonstration at the Sandy Community Church at 8 p. m. Friday.

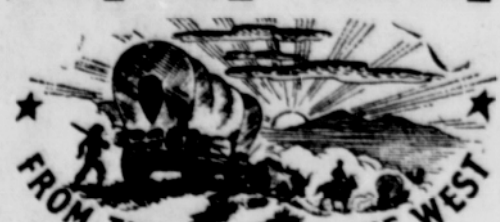
Prizes will be awarded for attendance, memory work and for bringing in the most new children to the school.

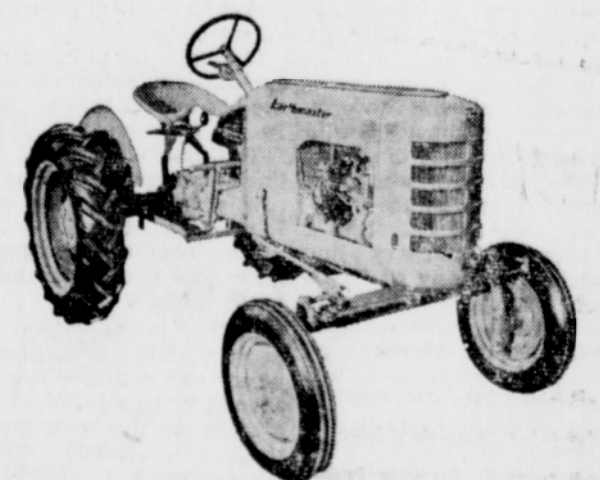
