RHODODENDRON—The Mountain really had a wind-dipper of a storm last week end.

At least four houses were damaged and one was demolished.

From all counts there were at least 100 trees blown down — and how many branches of all sizes, no one will ever know.

A tree at least three feet in diameter and about 60 feet long missed the Alpine Hut by 20 feet.

A good miss, but it was certainly a tremendous tree.

At the Peter Hefty house, a large tree fell across the drive way.

At the Joe Kiefer home a large branch broke a pane in the window—the wind was so strong that it blew a heavy object off the desk where the window was broken.

About 20 feet of the top of Conway's virgin fir tree was ripped off.

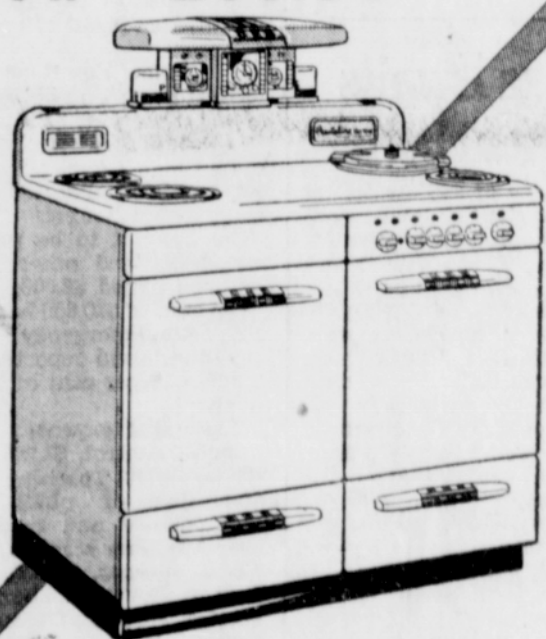
