Mrs. Ted Gray Dies Suddenly on Thursday

Cause of death was said to be acute bronchopneumonia. Mrs. Gray first became ill Christmas morning, her physician said. She apparently was in a run-down condition and the illness swiftly ran to its tragic conclusion.

A life-long resident of the Boring and Sandy communities, Mrs. Gray was born April 4, 1910, in Boring. Her maiden name was Genevieve Doreus Jonsrud. She was educated in Boring and Sandy schools.

She was married to Mr. Gray on July 31, 1931, in Vancouver, Wash. Mrs. Gray was a member of the Methodist church.

Services were held in the chapel of the Carroll Funeral Home and were conducted by Dr. George W. Bruce, William Elliott sang. Interment was at the Sandy Cemetery.

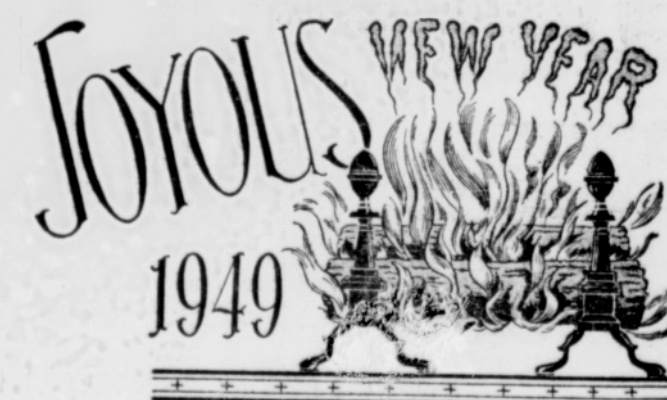
