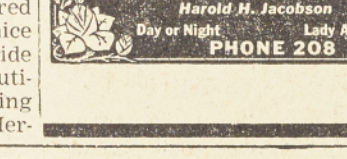
The American Legion auxiliary held a cake-walk last week; \$16.30 was grossed. Mrs. Kozman is president of the auxiliary.
