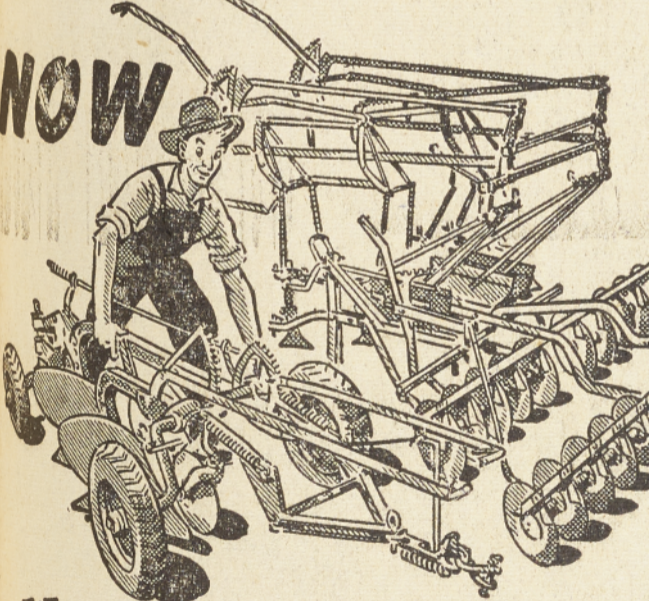

Cowpokes to Send Student With Sandy Grange Scholarship to OSC

The Sandy Grange, sponsors of the Cowpokes, the local 4-H club, will give a scholarship to one of the members of the 4-H club for a 10-day summer school session at Oregon State College, according to Mrs. John J. Dunn, Sandy, home economics chairman of the Sandy Grange.

There are four boys eligible for the scholarship. They are Bill MacDonald, Robert Fitzgerald Jr., Udine Urban, and Edward Whitlock.

The scholarship entitles the winner to a 10-day session at Oregon State college, Corvallis, with entertainment instruction, and experimenting scheduled during the period. The closing date for scholarship competition is April 20 and each club is asked to choose at least one candidate and one alternate for each candidate, according to Mrs. Myrabelle Paul, county 4-H agent. The candidates are chosen on the basis of their work on 4-H club projects, their over-all ability and their leadership qualities. Each sponsoring group chooses its own candidate and final approval comes from the county 4-H office.

Candidates must be 12 years old, according to Mrs. Paul.

During the summer session at Oregon State college, Mrs. Paul said, courses in home economics, agriculture, recreation, and husbandry will be held, under the directorship of the regular Oregon State faculty members.

Last summer about 2,000 4-H club members attended the Oregon State summer sessions. More than 125 of the enrolled summer-school students were from Clackamas county, according to Mrs. Paul.

Besides the scholarship awarded to the members of the Cowpokes there will also be students from Cottrell, Dover, and Zig Zag. The Cowpokes met at the Sandy Grange headquarters Saturday, April 16, with Mr. and Mrs. William F. MacDonald, their leaders. The members voted for their choice in the scholarship, but the final decision depends on the points earned by each of the candidates, and the decision of the central office of the 4-H.

Mr. MacDonald reported a large increase in membership over the last year. Now the Cowpokes consist of four girls and 17 boys. Preparations are being made by the Cowpokes for the big vaudeville show to be held April 30 in the Grange hall at 8 p.m. At that time the Sandy Grange will also feature a pie social and a food sale as a benefit for the scholarship fee for the Cowpokes.

WEED CONTROL NOTICE Application of the state law for compulsory eradication of Taney (tagwort) and Irish Gorse from all lands in Clackamas county is now in effect. Spraying to kill these noxious growths should be done as soon as possible. May 1 is the deadline for applying for refunds for cost of spray materials under soil conservation provisions of the F.M.A. Your complete cooperation will be appreciated in making this weed elimination campaign a success. Lack of cooperation by property owners where either or both of these weeds is found will mean the county will do the elimination work and file a lien for the cost against the property. County crews will work on eradication as soon as seed stalks or pods appear on the two weeds.
