BORING — Boring's baseball team played two benefit games for Mrs. Harold Hunt, Estacada, who recently lost her husband in a motorcycle accident.

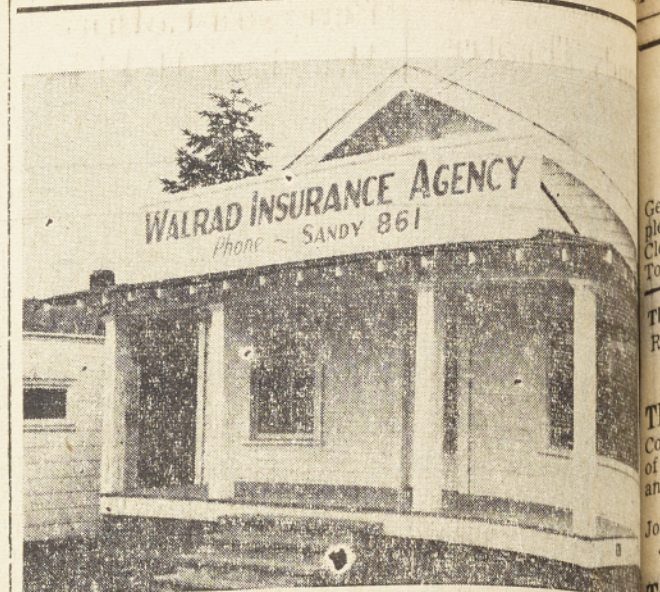

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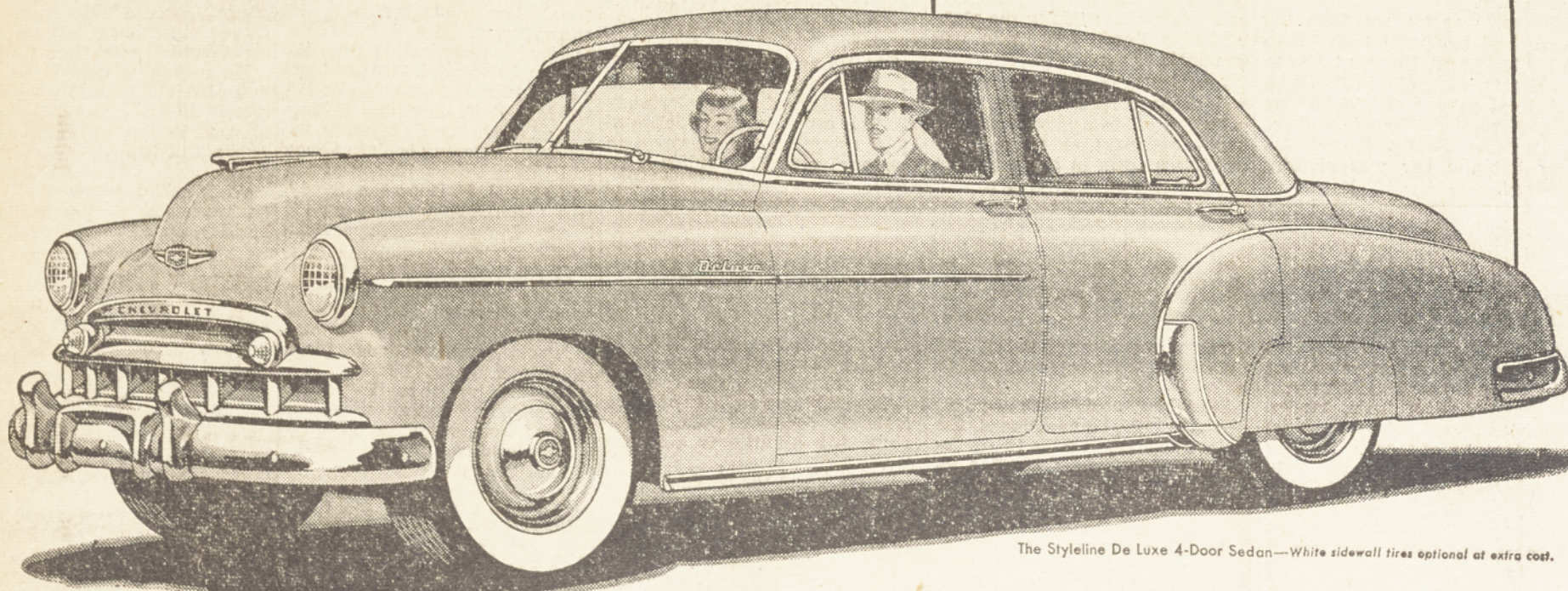
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
