The Sandy Post Recipe This Week Features New Look for Beet Dishes

A recipe received by The Sandy Post this week from the Best Foods Consumer Kitchen that may be of interest to some of the Sandy area homemakers, is a unique and different way of preparing beets. Most family members have frowned on beets for generations, so perhaps this may be a solution to some housewife's problem.

SAVORY BEETS MAYONNAISE

1 teaspoon grated orange peel ½ teaspoon salt
½ cup orange juice 3 tablespoons mayonnaise
¼ cup sugar ½ cup sour cream
1 teaspoon cornstarch 3 cups whole cooked or canned beets.

Heat grated peel and orange juice in double boiler. Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt, add all at once and stir until thickened and clear. Add blended mayonnaise and sour cream. Add drained beets and heat in double boiler 15-20 minutes. Yield: 6 servings.

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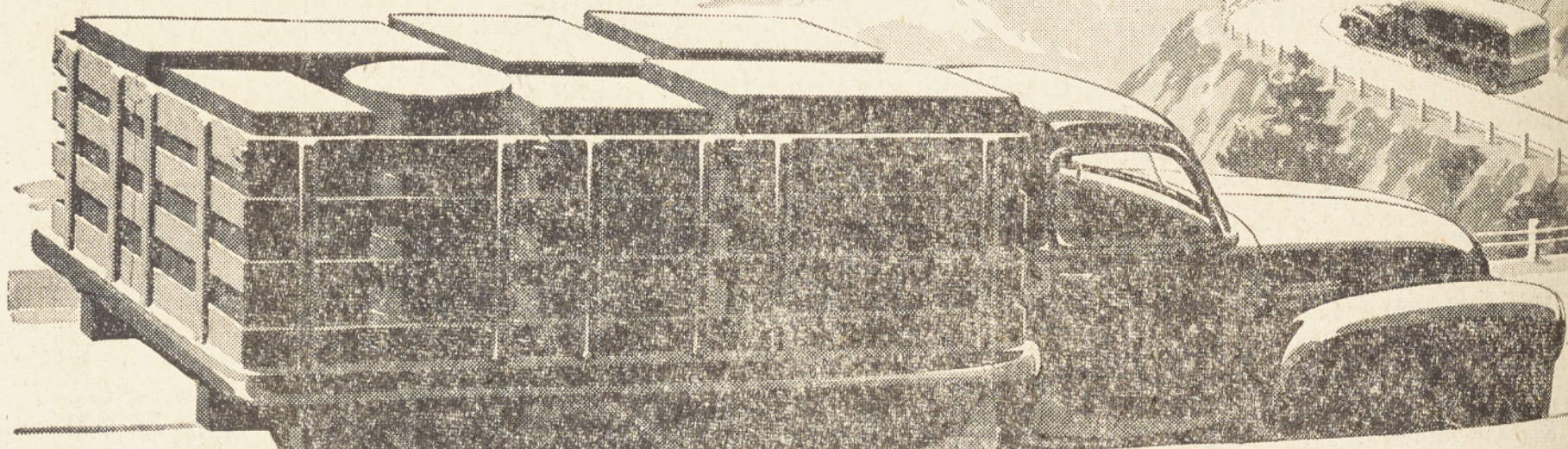
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
