To Guests from Iowa

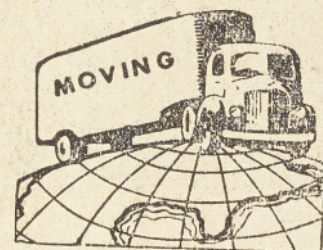
Mr. and Mrs. Carl Peterson had as guests last week, Mrs. Jennie Fullerton and daughter Helen from Mason City, Iowa.
