Raymond C. Murrays Feted On Golden Wedding Anniversary

Mr. and Mrs. Raymond C. Murray, pioneers of the Cherryville area, celebrated their golden wedding anniversary at the home of their son and family, Mr. and Mrs. John C. Murray, Sandy, on Wednesday, February 22.
The Murrays were married in Sioux City, Iowa, on February 22, 1900, when the temperature was "15 below zero." They came to Oregon and settled first at Kelso, where Mr. Murray worked for Olson Lumber company.
They moved to a farm at Cherryville in 1908 where they still live at the present time. Mr. Murray was employed by George Bornstedt in one of the first grocery stores in Sandy. He worked on the PGE flume at Bull Run when it was constructed and "walked to work from Cherryville every day," he adds.
Mr. Murray later worked for the City of Portland and then for J. W. Creighton, a Rhododendron contractor, and built many summer homes of that area. In recent years until his retirement he was employed by the U. S. Forest Service. He is also a veteran of the Spanish American War, having served in Georgia with Company H, 52nd Iowa Volunteer Infantry.
They have three sons, all graduates of Sandy high school during their first years in the old building located on Mount Hood highway and Langerson road. They are: John R. Murray, in the insurance and real estate business in Sandy, Robert E. Murray, in the saw mill business, and George L. Murray, in construction at Long Beach, California.
Mr. and Mrs. Murray have five grandchildren, Robert, Patricia, and Michael, of Sandy; Walter, of Long Beach; Mrs. Albert Green, Kentucky; and two great-grandchildren, Holly and Vikki Su of Kentucky.
Mr. Murray was born at Council Bluffs, Iowa, and Mrs. Murray was formerly Margaret Friel and her parents came to Sandy early in the century also.
