The next regular meeting of the Sandy Ridge Woman's club will be held Thursday, May 4, at the home of Mrs. Norman Isaacs.

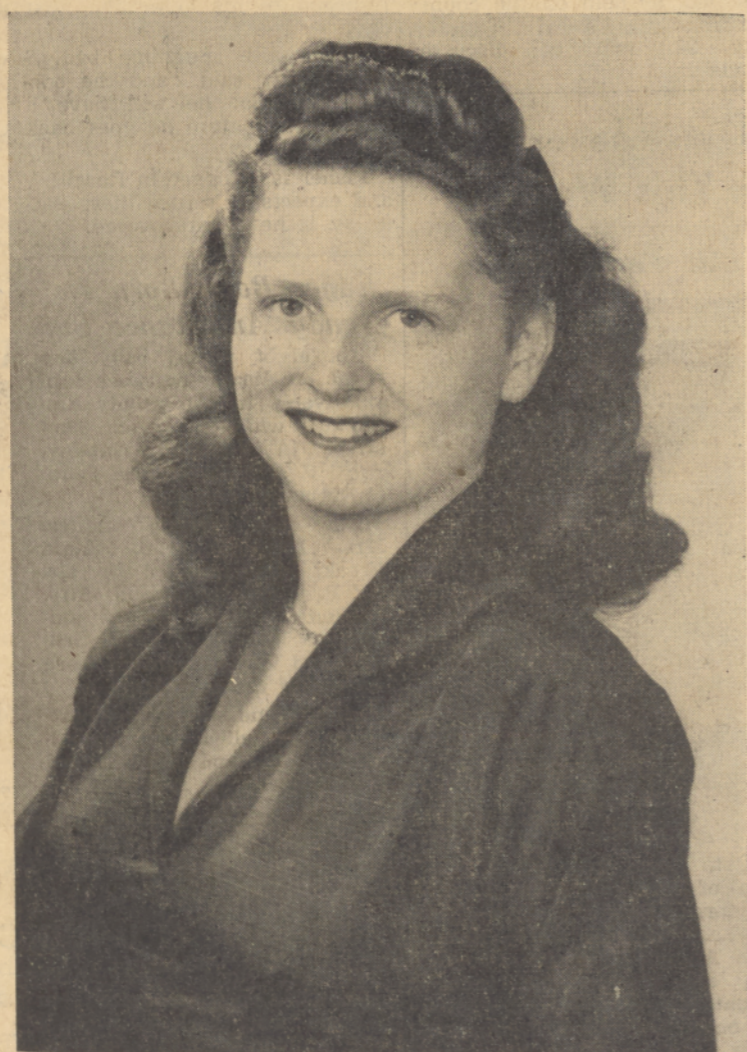
Hornback Family Reunites In Centralia
