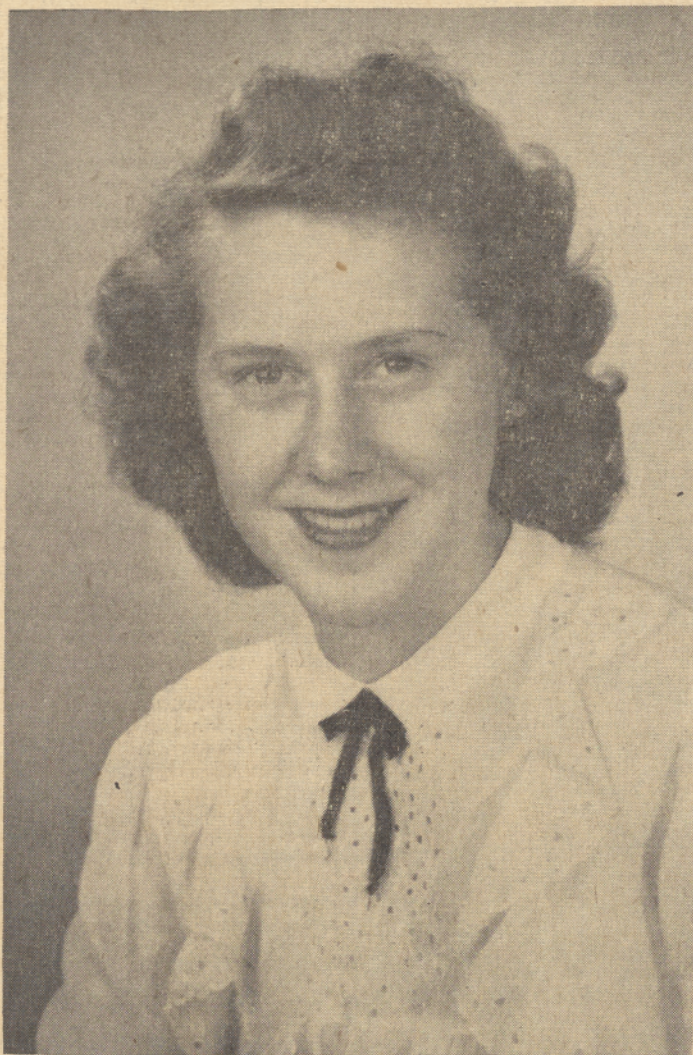
**Three Links Club To Sponsor Dance**

**Record Is Filled On Life Of George Rice, Local Son**

Because The Sandy Post was unable to get full details after the untimely death of George Rice two weeks ago, the following material was submitted by his parents and is printed this week for the benefit of George Rice's many school chums in the vicinity.



**George Rice**

George Rice was born in Burns, Oregon, February 8, 1931. His first and second years of school were spent in the grammar school at Glenn's Ferry, Idaho.

He graduated from the eighth grade at Sweet Home, Oregon, and took his first year in high school at Prineville.

While in high school he was proficient in athletics—particularly in track. Later, when he was 16 years old, he broke the record in the discus throw in the Greater Willamette track meet in 1947.

During that meet he also took a third place in the pole vault, and tied for first in the javelin throw.

Other sports in which George Rice was interested include hunting and fishing. He was an excellent swimmer and liked horses and riding. He and Jack Miller and several other recent high school graduates started and tried to maintain the Sandy Athletic club during 1948.

He joined the navy on his 18th birthday and took his boot training in San Diego, California.

He became a fireman on the U. S. Endicott, a destroyer mine sweep. His ship joined fleet maneuvers at the Hawaiian Islands in 1949. He left the navy February 7 at Treasure Island, San Francisco.
