Aschoff Farm To Become Dude Ranch

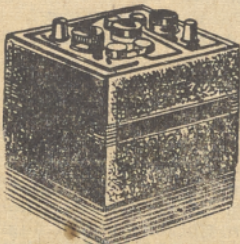

Mr. and Mrs. Aschoff's plans are uncertain at the moment.

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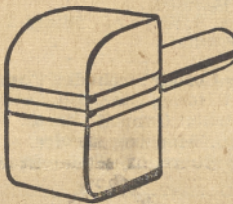
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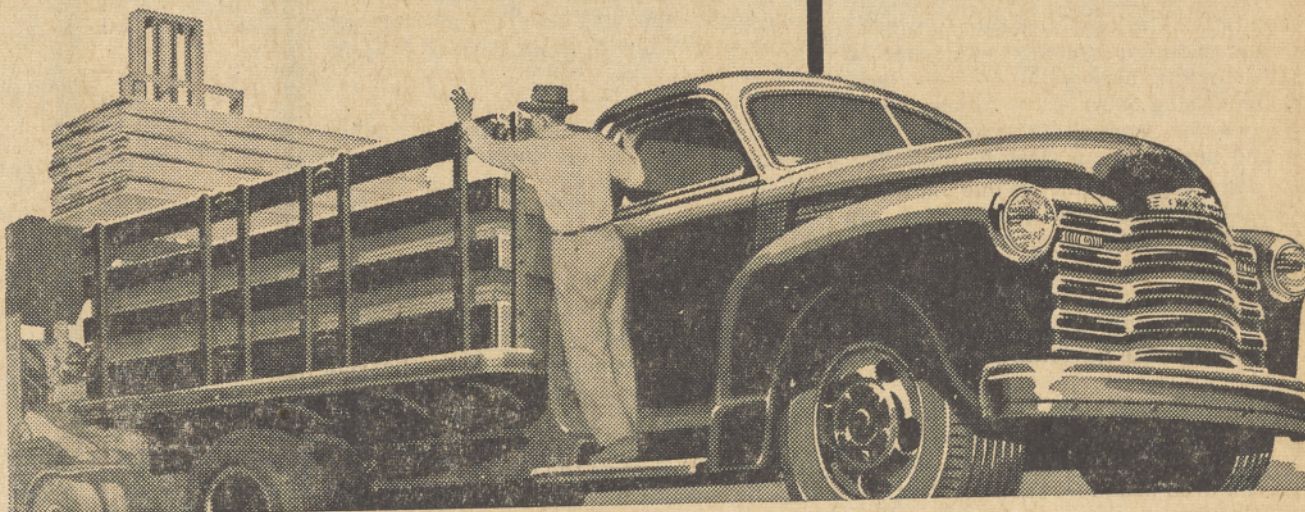
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
