Recipe Of The Week

By Terry Revenaugh This concoction sounded so amazing we couldn't wait to hand it to you. If anybody tries it, with any success, we'd love to hear about it. It's a cake.

- We dubbed it 'Blow Top' or 'Heedless Seedless.' Hold on to your hat. Here we go. 1/2 cup margarine, 1 cup sugar, 2 eggs, separated, 2 cups cake flour, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 cup Thomson seedless grapes, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 cup sugar.

Cream butter and the cup of sugar thoroughly. Add egg yolks and blend well. Sift flour, measure and sift again with baking powder and salt. Add to creamed mixture alternately with milk and vanilla. Fold in beaten egg whites. Pour into a wax paper-lined 8x12 inch pan, sprinkle with whole grapes.

Mix cinnamon with the 1/2 cup of sugar and sprinkle over grapes. Bake in a moderate oven (350 degrees) for 45 minutes. A tart lemon or spicy cinnamon sauce is supposed to heighten the effect of Blowtop. Rumor says the grapes will sink to the bottom but they'll stay whole anyway. Sort of a hidden surprise feature.
