Also attending were Mr. Brooks, Mrs. Carlstrom, Dr. and Mrs. William Grashorn.

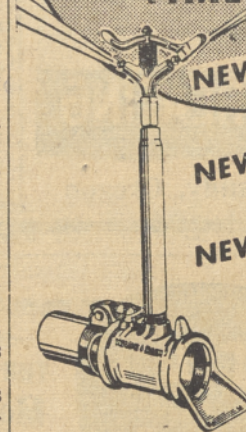
