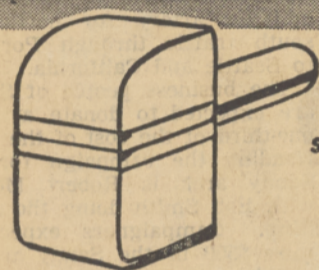

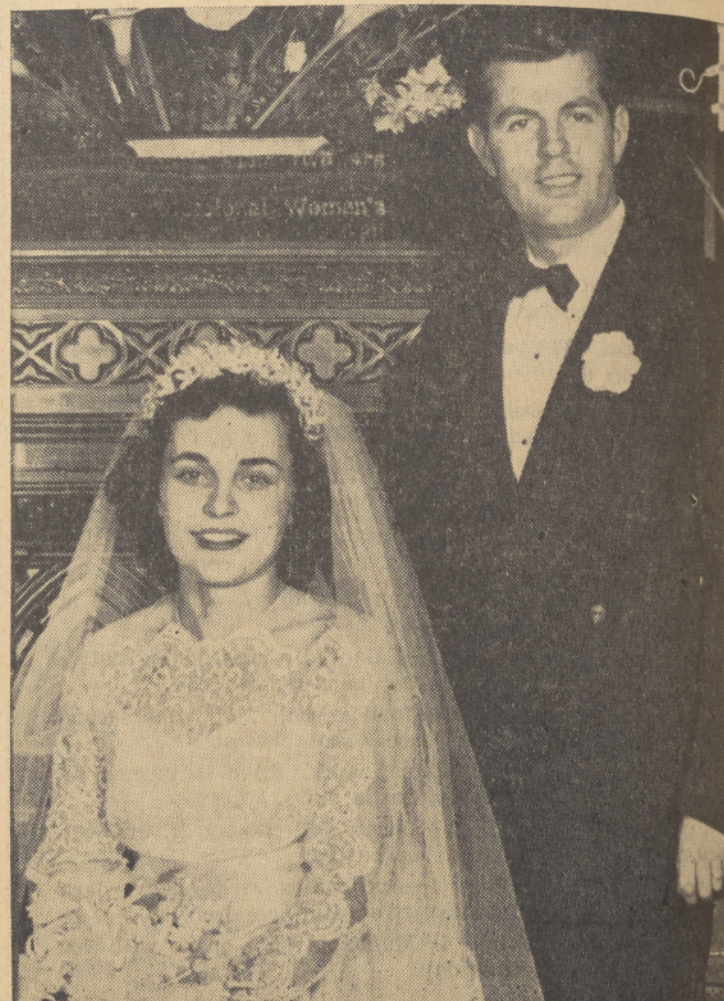
The bride is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clair S. Bruce,
